Pastor Dave's Corner:

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. —1 Corinthians 12:12, NRSVUE

Just two weeks ago, Ann Sansing, Dave Walter, and I attended the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference in Baltimore. The Annual Conference is both a regional group of churches and a yearly meeting where clergy and lay representatives from the local church and region come together to worship, make decisions, and celebrate our shared ministry.

The Annual Conference helps set the direction of the Annual Conference's mission, approves the annual budget for the coming year, and ordains new clergy. There are also opportunities for Bible study, fellowship, and networking. This is the place where local churches connect to the wider church and join in God's work on a larger scale.

In the August/September 2024 Pastor's Corner I mentioned the General Conference, of which we are connected through our Annual Conference, passed an amendment to the United Methodist Church constitution to restructure the UMC into regional conferences of which the United States would be its own regional conference. To be effective, it must be approved by 2/3 of all the voting members of all the annual conferences worldwide. If approved, this amendment will enable regional conferences to set ministry policies for more effective and vital mission within their regional contexts.

This amendment, along with 3 other amendments to our UMC constitution, were voted on at this Annual Conference. The other amendments were to affirm that gender and ability do not bar individuals from becoming members of a United Methodist congregation; revisions to strengthen denominational support of racial justice; and to clarify the educational requirements of clergy who may vote for clergy delegates to General Conference. The voting results will not be known until sometime later this fall after all the annual conferences worldwide have an opportunity to vote.

We also celebrated the new annual conference model adopted at last year's Annual Conference. This new model introduces six districts (replacing the previous eight) and organizes churches into "hubs," each anchored by one or more connecting churches. We are a part of the new "Lakes" district and Rev. Jim Miller will continue as



our District Superintendent. The hope is the new model will generate more vitality through increased congregational relationships, collaboration in shared ministry, innovation, discipleship, and connection amongst the churches within the hub.

I am excited that Poplar Springs UMC will be the connecting church for our hub. The other churches in our hub are Daisy, Howard Chapel-Ridgeville, Jennings Chapel, Lisbon, Morgan Chapel, Simpson, and St. Marks in Boyds. It is also bittersweet that Pastor T.J. Mount will be leaving Lisbon to assume the role of one of the "Vitality Specialists" in the Annual Conference. Many of you have gotten to know him and I have enjoyed working with him.

Please continue to hold Jennings Chapel, Poplar Springs, and all the congregations in our hub in prayer as we continue working with some and get to know some new additions to our collaborative ministry. Also, please hold Pastor T.J. in prayer as he grows into his new role and for Lisbon as they welcome a new pastor.

Poplar Springs History

Poplar Springs church was given a deed in August 1870, for a lot consisting of one acre of land to build a Methodist Protestant Church. Capt. Hiram Woodward, a master mechanic, who lived in the neighborhood, was the builder and took an unusual interest in the work. Ironically, he was the first one to be buried in the cemetery at the church. The church became a part of the nine church Howard Circuit. Then in 1885 the Howard Circuit was divided beginning the Lisbon Circuit (Poplar Springs, Jennings Chapel, Lisbon, Union Chapel, and Howard Chapel).

In 1939, the Methodist Protestant Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, South and the Methodist Episcopal Church joined to become The Methodist Church.

In 1953, being crowded for room, an addition was built onto the original building. At this time, the old pot-bellied stoves were removed, and a new oil-fired heating system was installed in both the old and new buildings.

In 1956 women were accepted for full ordination in the Methodist Church. In 1960, the double doors were cut into the church sanctuary from the Narthex. In 1962, being still crowded for more room, a little house and lot adjoining the church were purchased for approximately \$9,000.00. In 1962, the Lisbon Church left the circuit which reduced the circuit to only Poplar Springs and Jennings Chapel Churches.
