

#### **Pastor Dave's Corner:**

"God is our refuge and strength. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea. Be still, and know that I am God!" (Psalm 46:1-2,10, NRSVUE)

In this edition, I have traditionally recapped VBS and Camp Hope. And I'll say something briefly about those. I also wanted to update you on changes that recently came out of the UMC General Conference and our Annual Conference.

Our congregations were busy in July, with VBS, the Community Picnic, and then Camp Hope. None of these would have been possible without the time, talents, and financial resources shared by you and I thank you. For VBS, we also had help from Lisbon and Morgan Chapel.

Our VBS theme was *Scuba* and was led by Valerie Spampinato. The kids took a deeper dive in the Gospel of John during the week. The following week, 6 youths from Poplar Springs and Mt. Tabor went to Camp Hope, a Christian Appalachian work project that helps low-income homeowners repair their homes. We worked on Ms. Debbie Spiker's home in Keyser, WV. We replaced rotten T-111 siding on the back of her house and then repainted the back and side. We replaced and painted her screen door, replaced the hinges on the crawl space access door, and caulked between the fascia and her gutter to keep the rain from going between them. We also painted her kitchen, hallway and replaced a section of rotten flooring. On our final day, we presented her with a prayer shawl from Jennings' Prayer Shawl Ministry and Ms. Spiker gave each one of us a gift. I invite you to enjoy the pictures included in this edition.

At General Conference, the UMC's top legislative body, amendments were passed to the UMC's constitution to restructure the UMC into regions. To become effective, these amendments must be ratified by 2/3 of the 133 annual conferences around the globe. It would create regional conferences here in the U.S. and abroad with equal authority to set ministry policies for their missional contexts, including the ability to set their own standards for ordination and church marriage.

Over 700 delegates from four continents approved new Social Principles. This was a 12-year process to make the UMC's teachings on social issues more globally relevant, theologically grounded, and succinct.

The delegates, by a sizable majority, voted to remove the ban on the ordination of "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy and the officiation of same-sex weddings. At the same time, the General Conference passed legislation to protect clergy from being compelled to officiate at same-sex weddings and upheld that boards of trustees of individual congregations could set policies that ban same-sex weddings within their walls.

Rev. John Stephens, a delegate from the Texas Conference, a "self-defined conservative," and senior pastor of the theologically diverse megachurch Chapelwood UMC in Houston said, "You can be United Methodist and be traditional, believing marriage was instituted by God between a man and a woman. You can be a United Methodist and be progressive, believing marriage may include those of the same sex. Unity of the Body of Christ does not require uniformity, but it does require love."

Locally, the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference is going through a process of restructuring with the hope of generating more vitality through increased congregational relationships, collaboration, innovation, discipleship, and connection. Details are still being worked out but broadly speaking, the plan is to have 7 to 12 churches grouped in Collaborative Hubs in a shared, geographically-based mission field. Each hub will have a Connecting Church to facilitate collaborative work and vitality.

Hubs, in turn, will be grouped in one of six non-geographic districts based on whether the mission field is rural, suburban, or urban. The hope is it will create opportunities to network across geographic boundaries and learn from one another in geographically diverse but otherwise similar contexts. The hubs and districts will be organized into two administrative regions.

I know change can be disconcerting. At the same time, I'm excited to see how the Holy Spirit will inspire us as we experiment with a different way of structuring the church. My hope is that it will enable us to be more nimble, adaptable, and free to experiment within our local contexts to make disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.
